

Good discussions around developing the medical home model and increasing interprofessional team care to all family practices in the East. Laid the preliminary groundwork and discussions around collaborative and integrated care.

Healthcare Transformation

With the introduction of the Ontario Health Team, it was felt that family practice should not be an advisory council, but be part of the decision making process.

Council identified importance of an organized and inclusive voice representing all models of family practice in primary care-Solo, FHG, FHN, FFS, FHTs, CHCs.

- All health care and service professionals within all service models (private, forprofit, not for profit, religious/non-religious charities and public models)


Family Practice As Experts

Nomination Process per East-FPN By-laws

The Board shall identify candidates for the Board through the following process:

Annually, the Board shall appoint a Nominating Committee, including the past Chair, if available, the Executive Director, and at least two (2) Members-at-large from the membership.

The Board or Nominating Committee (as delegated by the Board) will identify the number of vacancies for the year's annual meeting of Members and shall conduct a skill-set and gap analysis each year as part of the nominations process. The Nominating Committee shall endeavour to ensure that the candidates reflect the geographic areas represented by the Corporation and, as a secondary consideration, funding model types.

Directors shall be evaluated based on their past performance. Renewal of their term shall not be automatic.

An open call for nominations shall be made in a manner to be determined by the Board and interested parties will be encouraged to submit written applications.

Applications shall be submitted to the chair of the Nominating Committee and shall be reviewed by the Nominating Committee.

A slate of candidates shall be developed by the Nominating Committee of those individuals who meet the criteria as identified by the Board.

The Nominating Committee shall recommend a slate of candidates to the Board for its approval. The Nominating Committee shall also recommend candidates for Officer positions in accordance with its terms of reference as approved by the Board.

The foregoing process is the exclusive nominating process for candidates for the Board. There shall be no nominations from the floor at the annual meeting of Members.





Figure 3 Self-reported symptoms in seropositive and seronegative children in January-June








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
